Term bookings are for regular users and are cheaper. Term bookings require 5 days notice to end the block booking (no cancellations). Public holidays are not charged but absences are. Make up days can be taken if absent.

Casual Bookings are more flexible, book in as needed and only 12 hours notice is required for cancellations. Late Cancellation fee is \$5.

Parents pay in cash at the end of the session. Parents are able to pay their full term fee at the beginning of the term if they wish and a copy of the payment sheet can be requested.

Come along for a nurturing day where your child can learn through play.

We run a mixed aged program at Occasional Care for children 4mths-6yrs. We offer long-term or short-term bookings so that parents can take a break, study, or attend appointments. Older children enjoy leadership opportunities and pre-school learning with an Early Childhood Teacher and team of Educators. Caring Educators also nurture the youngest children closely, and all children are enriched by the social nature of the service.

Enjoy an inspiring and inclusive teaching and learning environment.

Our collaborative program is based on the Australian Early Years Learning Framework as are all Licensed Children's Services including Long Day Care and Preschools. Childrens' interests inspire our planning.

We take many photos during the day of the children's learning journey, and these beautiful stories are shared with our children and parents. Our caring approach is based on our fundamental belief in the 'Circle of Security' attachment research, and secure, genuine relationships are developed with each and every child.

On arrival children and parents are welcomed in. Children place their morning tea, lunch and a drink into separate baskets.

Parents are asked to apply sunscreen, wipe their child's hands, sign the attendance sheet, and provide their best contact number for the day.

Careful and thoughtful planning is used to set up our play and learning spaces. Creative activities, group projects, or cooking are a highlight of each day. Time for learning through play and social engagement influence our daily routines. Indoor and outdoor play activities are mixed with regular, predictable routines which give staff the opportunity to engage with children on a 1 to 1 basis.

Music is an integral part of the day, with song and dance as part of our gentle transition times, meal times and story times. Each day the children are told a story where books, puppets, or props are used. Quiet time activities and turn taking games follow story times.

Why choose Occasional Care?

Occasional Care provides all the benefits of preschool; but also offers more affordable and flexible arrangements within a family centred program. You are welcome to visit our not-for-profit community service for an orientation where you and your child can stay and play or book in for short-term or long-term care as needed.

At MOCS we have a Reconciliation Action Plan and aim to make our indigenous Australian Aboriginal culture an important part of our curriculum.
